A true and correct copy of an e-mail from Jack Dail to Candace Dodge, Congressman Doolittle's Staff Assistant, containing this preliminary approval is attached as Exhibit 2. A true and correct copy of the Franking Commission's formal advisory opinion is attached as Exhibit 3.

6. Using software that Congressman Doolittle's office uses to track the history of official e-mails sent from the office to constituents, I have determined that Congressman Doolittle's office sent the Doolittle Email to the addresses sindeelouthomson@netscape.net and rthomson916@earthlink.net on May 25, 2007. Both those addresses are registered in the tracking software to Ronald Thomson, 1033 S. Bluff Dr., Roseville, CA 95678-1141.

I have also confirmed, using the tracking software, that on March 13, 2006, someone affirmatively opted to receive e-mails from the Congressman's office at the rthomson916@earthlink.net address, and that on June 6, 2007, someone affirmatively opted not to receive e-mails from the Congressman's office at the sindeelouthomson@netscape.net address. No emails were sent by Congressman Doolittle's office to the address sindeelouthomson@netscape.net after June 6, 2007.

7. On August 10, 2007, I caused both the sindeelouthomson@netscape.net and the rthomson916@earthlink.net e-mail addresses to be removed from the Congressman's e-mail list.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.



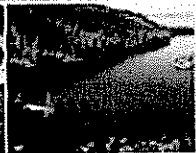

Doolittle Amendment Passes House

Ends mortgages for illegal aliens

WASHINGTON, DC – On Tuesday, the House of Representatives approved legislation by Rep. John T. Doolittle that will prevent financial lenders, such as Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac, from aiding illegal aliens with mortgages.

"Government-sponsored lenders should not be in the business of assisting illegal immigrants to purchase homes in the United States," said Doolittle. **"Allowing illegal immigrants to purchase a primary residence here is just another incentive that encourages illegal immigration. That needs to stop now and Tuesday's vote goes a long way towards making that happen."**
